Diagnostics and therapy: Can take a concise medical history, carry out a proper clinical examination, use the results to derive a working hypothesis and draw up a plan for the next steps (where possible, in accordance with the principles of evidence-based medicine)					
Ethics: Can apply tools for ethical decision-making and independently handle ethical issues that arise in professional routine					
Health economics: Considers a reasonable cost-benefit analysis (principle of "effectiveness, appropriateness and cost-effectiveness") when rendering diagnosis, therapy and prophylaxis					

Patient safety/error culture: Identifies risks, errors and complications at an early stage and manages them appropriately
